What is the program?

At Down South Aboriginal Health (DSAHA), we advocate for and assist clients in receiving & accessing healthcare services. Our team includes Aboriginal Health Practitioners, Transport & Outreach Workers plus Administration team members in Manjimup and Collie.

We offer transport and fuel vouchers to support access to appointments and facilitate health promotion events.

Services provided

Our team is committed to supporting mob to access and receive health related services and resources.

- Advocacy for and assistance in attending health services & appointments
- Partnering with other agencies to provide outreach services in our region
- Transport within a 30km radius of Collie and Manjimup
- Fuel vouchers for eligible clients
- Basic wound care
- Ear irrigation, otoscopy and audiology (ear and hearing services)
- Health assessments
- Health promotion events

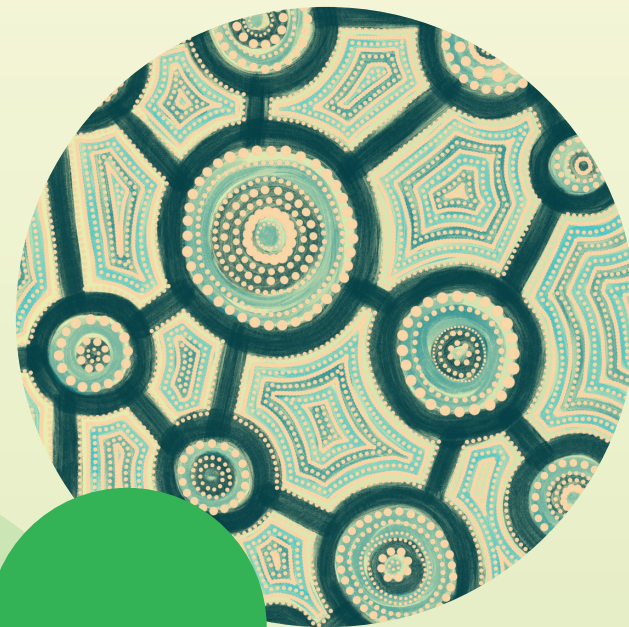
Who is eligible?

Clients can either self-refer or be referred to our service. Eligibility is open to anyone who identifies as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander. We are committed to providing our support and services to existing and new clients in our community.

We welcome people of all age and family groups, ensuring everyone can access support and services for moorditj health.

DSAHA helps improve access to high quality, comprehensive and culturally appropriate primary healthcare for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. We do this through providing transport to health services and community events, running targeted health activities and providing services to support the management of chronic conditions.

Access to health services, as well as coordinated healthcare are all important for good health. The DSAH team provides Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander mob access to the care they need in Collie and Manjimup areas, for moorditj health and wellbeing.
